Students must also complete SF State Studies requirements of AERM—American and Ethnic Racial Minorities, ES—Environmental Sustainability, GP—Global Perspectives and SJ—Social Justice. Students can complete SF State Studies through lower or upper division coursework. Transfer students with a verified AS-T or AD-T do not have to complete SF State Studies requirement; transfer students without an AS-T or AD-Tare encouraged to choose upper division coursework in order to ensure completion of SF State Studies.
